Curtis Robert Young is a historian, consultant and writer. He is professor of literature at ESSEC Grande Ecole. His current work celebrates the role played by African-American soldiers in 1917 France. He lives in Paris.

Maureen B. Fant's dual interests are Italian food and Roman archaeology—and anywhere they intersect. Her books include Sauces & Shapes: Pasta the Italian Way (IACP winner and James Beard finalist), Dictionary of Italian Cuisine, Women's Life in Greece and Rome, and the Williams-Sonoma Foods of the World volume on Rome. She has taught ancient Roman food (theory) and Roman home cooking (practice). She is a principal of Elifant Archaeo-Culinary Tours. She lives in Rome.

Richard Zimler has published ten novels over the last 18 years, including *The Last Kabbalist of Lisbon, The Night Watchman, Hunting Midnight, The Search for Sana, The Warsaw Anagrams* and *The Seventh Gate.* He was granted a 1994 U.S. National Endowment of the Arts Fellowship in Fiction. He lives in Portugal where he teaches at the University of Porto.
