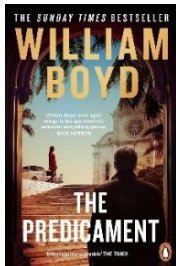


The Names

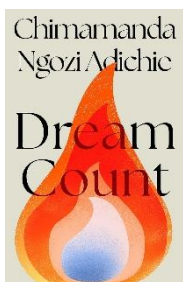

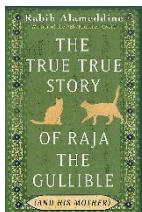


Dream Count

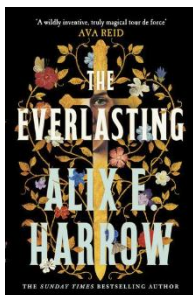


The True True Story of Raja the Gullible

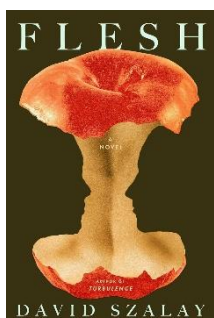


The Everlasting

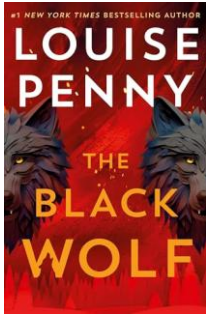
Flesh

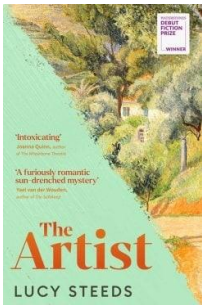

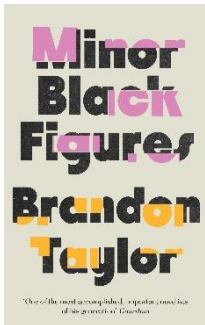
Chief Inspector Armand Gamache #20 **The Black Wolf** **Louise Penny**

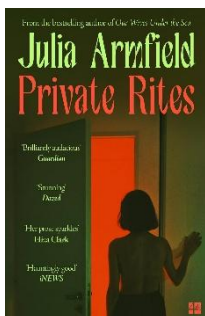
The Artist **Lucy Steeds** *published 2025*

Minor Black Figures **Brandon Taylor** *published 2025*

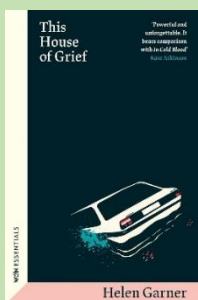

This House of Grief **Helen Garner** *published 2014*

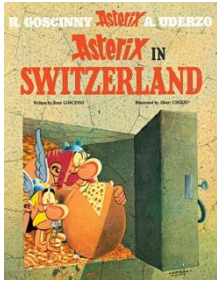
