
**The Book Club for Troublesome Women** [Marie Bostwick](#) *pub.2025*


**Great Big Beautiful Life** [Emily Henry](#) *published 2025*




**Small Mercies** [Dennis Lehane](#) *published 2023*






**Vera Wong #1 Vera Wong's Unsolicited Advice for Murderers**




**One Day in December** **Josie Silver**




**Selling Manhattan** **Carol Ann Duffy**




**Red Herrings and White Elephants** [Albert Jack](#), [Ama Page \(Illustrator\)](#)


**Charlie and the chocolate factory level 3** [Ladybird Books](#)




